## Glad to meet you: Christine Fonsale Rogerson

The Williamsburg Players is happy to announce a recent addition to our staff, Christine Fonsale Rogerson, who is joining us as the editor and creator of our playbill.

We asked Christine to introduce herself to our community and here is what she had to share:

"We moved from Washington, D.C., to Williamsburg last summer, when my husband accepted a teaching position in the theatre department of Christopher Newport University.

An actor myself, I sought auditions within the Tidewater theatre

community and found the Players. Ed Allen was casting *Arsenic and Old Lace* at the time. Though I wasn't right for the part, Ed asked me about helping The Players with graphic design work.

"The work was right up my alley. I worked for a professional regional theatre for 12 years in South Florida, serving as the print production manager, a marketing associate and the associate graphic designer, among other things. I had built or contributed to, proofed, designed, edited and collaborated on a great many play programs, posters, newsletters and flyers. "I love designing. It's an adventure, a discovery process. At times, design concepts come very quickly, while other projects have to be built slowly. It's an enjoyable process, and each one is different from the last. It's a collaboration.

"It's also a lot like acting, though in acting the palette is human, the elements are life situations, relationships, desires. The actor's tools build a fully fleshed-out character, but it is ultimately a collaborative art filled with discoveries.

"I am so glad to have the opportunity to contribute what I can to The Williamsburg Players. Thanks for inviting me in!"
