The Odd Couple – a classic Neil Simon comedy that according to some has been done to death. But think back. When was the last time you saw this play, if ever?

Personally I've only seen the play once – probably 25 years ago,

with Tom Poston and Tim Conway playing the leading roles. What an incredible treat! Sure I've seen the movie and the old television show – but the play, only once. And in the 56 year history of the Williamsburg Players, it's never been done. So when the Board of Directors decided to consider doing this show, I was very excited. And when they asked me if I'd be willing to direct it, even more so.

This is the wonderful story of two divorced men, Felix Ungar who is fastidious, tense and depressed, and Oscar Madison, a slob. After Felix is kicked out by his wife of 12 years, he moves in with Oscar, an old friend with whom he plays poker every week. Almost immediately, their opposing lifestyles become the source of tension and humor.

Taking the reins as Oscar is a newcomer to our stage, Doug Stewart, who has performed previously with the Courthouse Players in Gloucester. As Felix, we welcome back to the Players Alan Noblin, who appeared in numerous productions between 2000 and 2006. Rounding out the male portion of our cast are Caleb Myers as Speed, most recently seen on our stage in *Jesus Christ Superstar*, and newcomers Steve Pasco playing Murray the cop, Terry Nienhuis, a recent transplant from North Carolina, playing Roy, and Timothy Meyer, Jr. playing Vinnie. The roles of the Pigeon sisters are played by Stephani Siberski and Kat Drummond, both also new to our stage.

Performances are Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings at 8:00 pm with Saturday matinees at 2:00 pm.
