

It's just a noisy hall where there's a nightly brawl, and All That Jazz!

The musical *Chicago* is based on a play of the same name by reporter Maurine Dallas Watkins, who was assigned to cover the 1924 trials of murderesses Beulah Annan and Belva Gaertner for the Chicago Tribune.

Beulah Annan, the model for the character of Roxie Hart. was 23 when she was accused of the April 3, 1924 murder of Harry Kalstedt. The Tribune reported that Beulah Annan played the foxtrot record Hula Lou over and over for two hours before calling her husband to say she killed a man who "tried to make love to her". She was found "not guilty" on May 25, 1924. Velma is based on Belva Gaertner, who was a cabaret singer. The body of Walter Law was discovered slumped over the steering wheel of Gaertner's abandoned car on March 12, 1924. Two police officers testified that they had seen a woman getting into the car and shortly thereafter heard gunshots. A bottle of gin and an automatic pistol were found on the floor of the car. Gaertner was acquitted on June 6, 1924. Lawyers William Scott Stewart and W. W. O'Brien were models for a composite character of Billy Flynn.

Watkins' sensational columns documenting these trials proved so popular that she decided to write a play based on them. The show received both popular and critical acclaim and made it to Broadway in 1926, running for 172 performances. Cecil B. DeMille produced a silent film version, *Chicago* (1927), and was later remade as *Roxie Hart* (1942).

The underlying theme of the show is a satire on corruption in the administration of criminal justice and the concept of the celebrity criminal. In roaring twenties Chicago, chorine Roxie Hart murders a faithless lover and convinces her hapless husband Amos to take the rap, until he finds out he's been duped and turns on Roxie. Convicted and sent to death row, Roxie and another merry murderess, Velma Kelly, vie for the spotlight and the headlines, ultimately joining forces in search of the American dream: fame, fortune and acquittal.

Our production brings a host of newcomers to the Williamsburg Players' stage: Michaela Shutts (*Velma*), Morgan Sharrett (*Roxie*), Robert Weathers (*Billy Flynn*), Charity Robinson (*Mama Morton*), and ensemble members Jacquelyne Anderson, Nancy Collie, Carrie Letourneau, Adam Lemos, Ravenn McDowell, Eric Robinson, Rico Robinson, Katherine Ruble and Savannah Williams, along with returning WP veterans Janesse Chapman, Megan Gerth, Maurice Martinez, Rachel Marrs, Ingrid Holzer-Miller, Steve Pasco and Darrell Wood.

The production team consists of Peter Natale (*Director*), Dana Margulies Cauthen (*Choreographer*), Amy Insley (*Lighting*), Emily Silfies (*Costumes*), Catrina Berry (*Production Assistant*), Steve Olson (*Set Design*), Robert Kyle (*Hair & Makeup*) and Mike McCoy (*Musical Director*).

Performances are Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings at 8:00 pm with Saturday matinees at 2:00 pm. Tickets, \$18.00, can be purchased on our website, *www. williamsburgplayers.org*, where you can choose your exact seat, pay by credit card and print your tickets at home, thus bypassing the box office when you arrive at the theater. Tickets can also be purchased by calling the box office at (757) 229-0431 and leaving your name and phone number. A box office volunteer will return your call. Same day student tickets are available for \$10.00 at the door.


