lamented "Movies are a horrible burden on our souls, but that's okay because I love burdens on my soul!" Present theatres awake each day convinced it will be their last, and a thousand years from now producers and directors will question why they create entertainment with real people, but predictions about the death of theatre will always remain.

Welcome to the world of the Hays, a once renowned theatrical family reduced to doing repertory in 1953 Buffalo. George and Charlotte Hay, former B-movie stars, are not getting roles anymore, and they refuse to embrace this new thing called "television." They stubbornly cling to live theatre and their dream of landing a big film. Just when hope seems lost, they get a call from Frank Capra, the Steven Spielberg of his generation, with an offer to star in his latest production. Happy days are here again! What could possibly go wrong?

Well ... everything. George has a dalliance with a young ingénue, and his transgression is discovered precisely at the moment he receives the call from Frank Capra.

Charlotte storms off; George becomes inconsolable; and just when everything is coming up roses, all is lost.

Only the efforts of the company can save the dream. Capra is coming to the matinee, treating it as George and Charlotte's audition, but in the throes of despondency, George has gone missing. When the company finally finds him, he's stinking drunk and completely unable to act. But there's no turning back now; the show must go on! Capra witnesses an unforgettable performance when he attends the matinee.

Moon Over Buffalo is a show that can be fall-from-your-seat funny, and this cast delivers the farcical punch to do it. Leading the charge are David Brown and Kat Drummond, with their madcap misadventures supported by Lauren Burwell, Caleb Myers, Kathy Dean, Paul Wildenberger, Steve Pasco, and Alyssa Brayboy. It's one of those rare casts who own a play, and this ensemble has the power to leave you in stitches. Don't miss WP's production of Ken Ludwig's Moon Over Buffalo. You will howl with laughter!





Spence, chair of the Scholarship Committee, gave her report and introduced Jessica DiPette, our scholarship winner this year. She will be receiving a \$2,000 grant from the Players to attend The University of Miami, majoring in Theater. Also at the meeting, Connie Granger, Peter Natale and Hugh Siggins were elected to new three-year terms on the Board and Marsha Allen, who had been appointed to fill a vacancy, was also elected. The members were also brought up to date on the changes to the facility and those anticipated this year.

One of the new programs that we will be participating in this year is hosting two courses for Christopher Wren Association in our theater.
