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

"Into the Woods it's time to go..."

I love this show and I have loved this show since I first listened to the cassette tape when the show opened on Broadway in 1987. Stephen Sondheim has always

been my favorite musical composer, so it wasn't a surprise when I fell in love with *Into the Woods*. I knew then, when I was in high school, that someday, not only would I love to land a role in the show, but I wanted to direct it; to put my own personal spin on the story and the characters.

At first glance, the show is a retelling of popular fairy tales - Cinderella, Little Red, Jack, Rapunzel, a Witch, a Giant - with the addition of a new story about a baker and his wife. As you would expect, the characters go *Into the Woods* to find their wish: be it a prince or gold or beauty or a child, and they meet with obstacles along the way. But the story doesn't end when they find their "happily ever after." The creative team of Stephen Sondheim and James Lapine take the leap of exploring what happens after all your wishes are granted, and in doing that, the characters face the same questions *WE* face in our non-fairy tale world.

As much as I would love to play every character in the

Our production staff is like no other, with Andrew Blackmon, Jan Bomar, Neil Hollands, Jason Kriner, Amy Lyles, Brandon Lyles, Mike McCoy, John Trindle, and Michael Westenberger. Along the way we have gained important knowledge such as: "When going to hide, know how to get there and how to get back, and eat first."

It is an amazing story, with brilliant music and I hope, we hope, you'll go *Into the Woods* with us.






