

Our initial production of the Williamsburg Players' 2015-2016 Season features "real" the and "reel" worlds of the Tony® Award winning City of Angels. Set in the glamorous and seductive Hollywood of the '40s, the world of film studios and filmy negligées, City of Angels chronicles

the misadventures of Stine, a young novelist, attempting a screenplay for movie producer/director, Buddy Fidler. Stine strives to stay true to his detective alter ego, Stone, all the while fighting to save his friendships, his career, and his marriage.

The City of Angels is one of the most technically and artistically challenging shows that the Players has ever undertaken. It is actually two shows in one. It is the interweaving of two plots, one dealing with the writing of a screenplay in the legendary Hollywood of the 1940s; the other, the enactment of that screenplay. This double feature quality leads to many other unique production values, the most notable being the fact that City of Angels is perhaps the only "color coded" show any theatre audience is likely to see. The movie scenes of our "reel" world appear in shades of black and white, and the "real" life scenes are in color.

The show also boasts two musical scores. One provides the cast with numbers to help reveal certain emotions or to celebrate particular moments in the way that only music can. The "other" score was written to emulate pure movie soundtrack music, 1940s vintage. It is entirely appropriate, then that the final curtain comes down on two happy endings.

Returning to our stage is David Stallings (Stine), who was last seen on the Williamsburg Players' stage in The 39 Steps, and his counterpart, Stone, is played by John Cauthen, a familiar face on our stage, last seen as Nathan Detroit in Guys and Dolls. Also returning is Rani Wachter (Gabby/ Bobbi), seen on stage in our special holiday showcases

last season as well as the Witch in Into the Woods. Jennifer Lent, last seen on our stage as Adelaide in Guys and Dolls, is Donna/Oolie, and Amanda Knowlton, last seen on our stage as Sarah Brown in Guys and Dolls, plays Carla/ Alaura. Jeff Sherman, last seen in Peter Pan here at the Williamsburg Players, portrays Buddy/Irwin and Bess Worley returns as Avril/Mallory. Bess hasn't appeared with us since she played Rose in Secret Garden in 2003! New to our stage is Alex Bagoly, a senior at Woodside High School, as Peter/Sonny and making his very first appearance on any theatrical stage is Greg Dowell, who has taken on the roles of Pancho/Lt. Munoz. Welcome to both of these actors.

Familiar faces rounding out our cast are Bill Chronis (Werner/Luther), Neil Hollands (Jimmy/Dr. Mandril), Sharon Hollands (Yamato) and Starla Eve Kramer (Bootsie). New to Williamsburg Players, but not new to the stage, are two married teams - husband Roy Chesson (Big 6/Pasco) and wife Erika Chesson (Della/Margaret), and husband Carsten Berndt (Mahoney) and wife Jenny Hart-Berndt (Hairdresser).

We hope you will join us for this musical and comedic homage to the film noire detectives of the '40s, City of Angels!


A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

The Williamsburg Players has awarded Brooke Gorsica, a York High School graduate, its 2015 McCulley-Scammon Scholarship. Betsy Jo Spence, Scholarship Chair, made the announcement at the Players' Annual Meeting. The Scholarship has been in existence since 1985.

This year graduating high school students from 29 public and private schools on the Greater Virginia Peninsula were invited to apply for the Scholarship, a \$2,000 award over 4 years of higher education during which the recipient continues studies in a theatrical field. Academic performance, achievements, goals and community service activities were all considered.

Gorsica auditioned before and was interviewed by a panel of judges with extensive theatre expertise and experience. Attending George Mason University, her major field of study will be Theatre and Performing Arts.

THE WILLIAMSBURG PLAYERS Remember & Honor Mollie Robbins



Mollie Robbins was one of the Williamsburg Players' favorite performers for many years. The Players was a fairly new group, just a few years into organizing itself, when Mollie and her husband Leo arrived in Williamsburg in the early 1960s. Shortly thereafter the Players and Mollie found each other and a happy future was assured for both.

Mollie had taken up theatre arts as a hobby while in high school in England. She found she enjoyed it and continued on to repertory and little theatre work afterwards. When she arrived in Williamsburg as a new bride she was more than pleased to find a community theater close to her new home. The Players were equally pleased to find a trained "thespian" ready to join their troupe.

Patrons of the Players loved Mollie for her excellent acting skills and especially her accent. Mollie played aristocratic ladies and quirky scullery maids with equal enthusiasm; perhaps with a different accent, but always genuine London British. When she was not on stage, or working backstage, Mollie loved to meet ticket holders in the lobby and talk about the show or future productions. Her "day job" was for many years as a "Hostess" (now, costumed interpreter) for Colonial Williamsburg where she was widely known and admired.

Mollie never got to play the "new theater" but she did enjoy seeing several shows in its "hugeness" as she called it. A survivor of the WPs' "gypsy" years when shows were played in borrowed ballrooms, auto showrooms, and school auditoriums, Mollie nested into the (former) theater on Hubbard Lane and loved her years there. We remember her with respect and love. Her spirit is ever with us.
