Marcia, a transplanted to Virginia Mid-Western Manhattanite, has successfully combined a former professional (AEA, SAG and AFTRA) and now "for the love of the show" acting and singing career in both musical theatre and nightclubs.

Marcia grew up in Indiana and taught high school Speech, Drama, and English in her hometown of Anderson, Indiana. She was also on the Board of Directors of the local community theater, Madison County Dramatic Players. She holds an M.S Degree from New York University in Educational

Theater and through NYU studied abroad in England. Marcia spent 30 years in Manhattan, NY as a teacher, nutrition educator and singer/actress/entertainer. She also obtained her M.S. in Nutrition at Columbia University and had a private nutrition and personal training practice in NYC before moving to Williamsburg in 2007.

Since coming to Williamsburg Marcia has created the role of "herself" in an original ensemble musical performed at the Williamsburg Players (WP) entitled *Heart and Music: A Valentine to the Theater* conceived, written and directed by Neil Hollands. She was featured as <u>General Cartwright</u> in *Guys and Dolls* last season, and created the roles of <u>Carlotta Campion</u> in *Follies (PIPS)*, Sister Mary Regina (<u>Rev Mother</u>) in *Nunsense* (*Showstoppers*), <u>Joanne</u> in *Company (WP)*, <u>Charity Barnum</u> in *Barnum (WP)*, <u>Mother Abbess</u> in *The Sound of Music (EVSPA)*, <u>Vera</u> in Female Version of *The Odd Couple*, and has appeared as solo and ensemble artist in four Showstoppers musical revues at the Kimball Theatre. She is currently in the cast of **WP** Jekyll and Hyde as Lady Beaconsfield. She would also love to see the **Readers Theatre** program come back to Williamsburg Players. She was an active participant in the program and through Brandon Lyles was first introduced to the Williamsburg Players stage in the old "Black Box" which holds a special place in her heart.

She currently is a full-time Registered Dietitian Nutritionist in private practice in Williamsburg.
